# 10:15-11:45am How Processing Trauma Affects Reporters—and What To Do About It Carola E. Green

This workshop examines trauma and its impact on court interpreters. It will distinguish the difference between stress and vicarious trauma, including burnout. The focus will then shift to research-based ways to prevent, or reduce the impact of, vicarious trauma. It will also consider the parallels and relationships between court interpreters and court reporters in the context of trauma. This presentation explores best practices for trauma-informed services, specific strategies for working effectively with witnesses and victims of violent crime in court settings, and assisting court users in public service areas in stressful matters such as domestic violence, sexual assault, custody, support, dependency, and violent crime.
